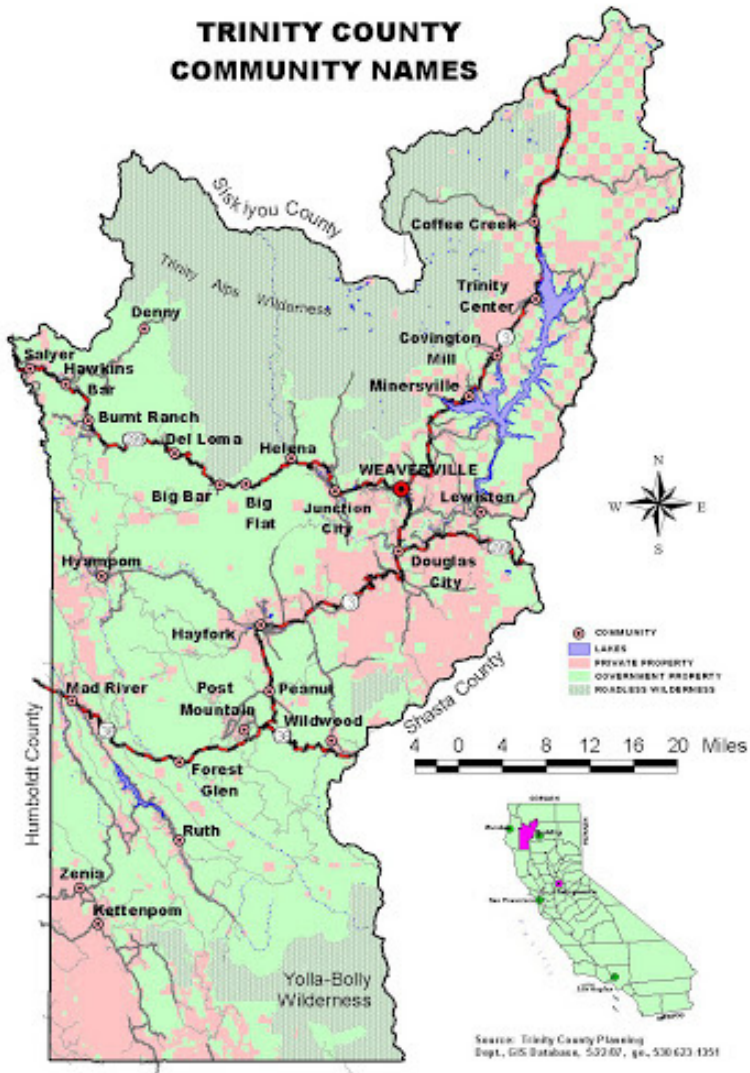
California Coalition for Youth (CCY) **(916) 514-4464**
